Endowed, Non-endowed & Pass-thru Scholarships

Division of Animal & Nutritional Sciences

American Dietetic Association Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded annually at the discretion of the organization.

Davis ~ Michaels Scholarship

Undergraduate students enrolled in the Pre-Veterinary Program in the Davis College Division of Animal & Nutritional Sciences are eligible for the Davis~Michael Scholarship. Recipients must have excellent test scores and high school GPA for consideration. The scholarship may be renewed until the completion of an undergraduate degree as long as the recipient continues to meet eligibility requirements. Those who successfully complete the Pre-Veterinary Program may be eligible for similar types of scholarship for veterinary colleges or schools as they pursue a degree of Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.

Division of Animal & Nutritional Sciences Senior Scholarship

This scholarship will be awarded to seniors majoring in the Division of Animal & Nutritional Sciences. Recipients will be chosen based on need, ability, and achievement.

H.C. Olson Scholarship

This scholarship is open for regularly enrolled students in the WVU Davis College of Agriculture, Forestry & Consumer Sciences who are majoring in Animal and Nutritional Sciences. Preference will be given to those students who emphasize dairy processing in their studies. The recipients must demonstrate high academic promise as determined by dairy processing faculty and other appropriate officials of the WVU Davis College. If candidates for this scholarship have equal qualifications, then preference shall be given to students having need for financial assistance as determined by appropriate officials of the Office of Student Financial Aid. The selection of the recipients shall be made by dairy processing faculty members.

H.E. Kidder Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship is open to students majoring in the Davis College Division of Animal & Nutritional Science who are of junior or senior rank with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher. Recipients must provide proof of acceptance into a graduate or professional school program prior to final selection. Selection is based on academic performance with added consideration for leadership and financial need. Scholarships may be renewed up to 10 semesters as long as the recipient continues to meet eligible requirements. Scholarships are awarded annually at the discretion of the Kidder Memorial Scholarship Trust.

Livesay Agriculture & Forestry Endowed Scholarship

Will be awarded to an Animal and Nutritional Sciences Major in good academic standing who has demonstrated financial need.

Mary Lee, William D. & William G. Martin Scholarship

This one-year (non-renewable) scholarship award(s) is for students within the Division of Animal and Nutritional Sciences of the WVU Davis College of Agriculture, Forestry & Consumer Sciences and shall be awarded in the names of Mary Lee and William Dwight Martin. Preference shall be given to regularly enrolled freshman students and incoming transfer students from Potomac State College. Other classes of students, including graduate level students, facing serious financial difficulties may be considered eligible recipients. In all instances, however, the recipient(s) will have declared his or her major in a program within the Division of Animal and Nutritional Sciences and shall have demonstrated a) need for financial assistance and b) high academic promise as determined by the appointed scholarship committee of the Division of Animal and Nutritional Sciences in consultation with the WVU Davis College Scholarship Committee.

Robert S. Simons Livestock Judging Scholarship

All recipients must be a member of the livestock judging team within the WVU Davis College of Agriculture, Forestry & Consumer Sciences. Recipients shall demonstrate academic promise by achieving a G.P.A. of 3.0. Scholarships shall be awarded in the name of Robert S. Simons.

Sarah Protzman Arbruckle Human Nutrition & Foods Scholarship

Preference will be given to students identified for aid through the WVU Scholars Program who also meet the requirements of this fund. The recipients shall be U.S. citizens who are regularly enrolled undergraduate students majoring in Human Nutrition and Foods in the Division of Animal & Nutritional Sciences of the WVU Davis College of Agriculture, Forestry & Consumer Sciences. The recipients shall have a) demonstrated need for financial assistance and b) academic promise as determined by the Office of Student Financial Aid and the College.

WV Dietetic Association Scholarship

Scholarships are awarded annually at the discretion of the organization.

West Virginia Poultry Scholarship

Open to freshman or incoming transfer student with proof of acceptance into the Division of Animal and Veterinary Science. If a suitable freshman or transfer applicant is not available, the recipient may be selected from students currently enrolled in the program. The recipient must be a resident of WV with a minimum high school cumulative GPA of 2.5 and a declared career interest in Poultry Science. Selection will be based on academic performance, leadership ability, financial need and a demonstrated interest in poultry science. The selection of the recipient(s) shall be determined by the Division of Animal and Veterinary Science. The division shall confer with the Scholarship Advisory Committee and the WVU Office of Student Financial Aid for the purpose of determining the most qualified recipient(s). The scholarship shall be applied to tuition, room and board, and/or other related educational costs.

William Brent Maxwell Memorial Scholarship

One annual scholarship with preference to WV resident students majoring in animal science and pre-veterinary medicine will be awarded. Recipients shall maintain satisfactory academic achievement as established by the Office of Financial Aid in administering this scholarship. A recipient shall be eligible for up to four years support.
